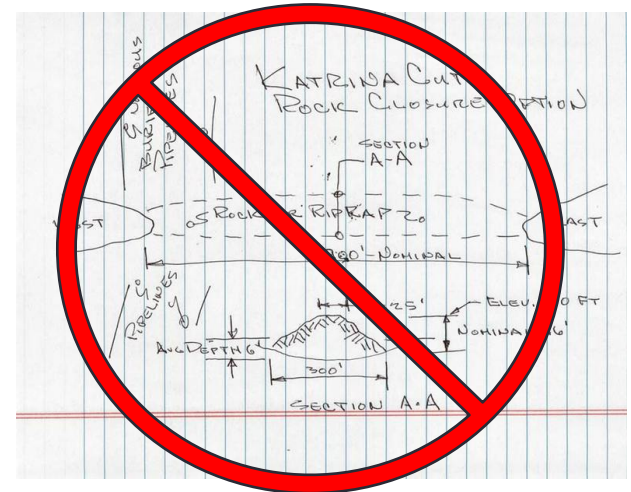

Notes on Slide Content

- Check for misspelling and grammar mistakes on slides
- Number your slides!!!!
- Do not show pictures of things you have drawn on paper...ever!
- Provide a reference (link is ok) for any image you did not create or data you did not collect
- Do not capitalize some words in bullets and not others, e.g.
 - Our design is great
 - We are Working on Making it Better

Presentation Skills

- Do not read from cards or the computer
- Look at the audience, talk to the audience
- Do not talk about things that are not on the current slide
- Either talk about everything on the slide or tell the audience you are just going to review highlights
- You are a team, so always say “**we**” instead of “**I**” even if you were the only one that did something
- Do not use words and terms that you are unfamiliar with
- Try to speak naturally...do you say “thee” in your everyday conversation?

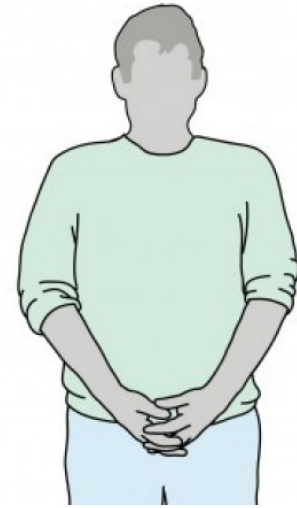
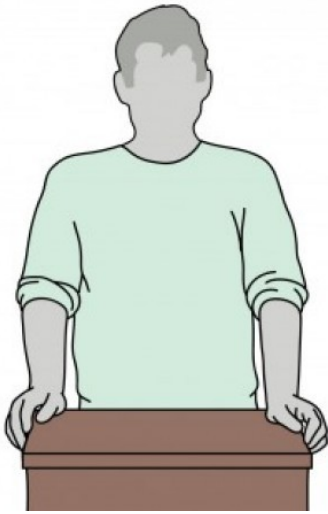
Professionalism

- Professional attire...no jeans
- No jokes
- Don't BS when you answer questions...saying you don't know is just fine
- Practice until you don't use the words "um" or "uh" or "like"

- Hands in pockets = scared or a lack of confidence
- Crossed arms = angry or uncomfortable
- Don't make **noise** with your hands as you gesture

Q&A

- Let the audience finish their question before you answer it
- Plan for more than one person to answer questions
 - Decide ahead of time who will answer questions on which topics
- Have a good Q&A slide that you want up behind you for ~7 minutes during questions



Other Things

- If you are not speaking, try not to look miserable; maybe look at the person speaking
- No tiny text, including on software generated images
- Be sure all your animations and videos are working and don't count on having the internet available
- If you are spending more than ~30 seconds on a slide, you are either not speaking efficiently, or you have too much content and need to make it two slides (or add animation)
