

RESEARCH OPPORTUNITIES

Students receive training in diverse research methods, including quantitative, qualitative, and mixed-methods approaches to understanding public health problems and community-engaged research approaches for developing and evaluating effective interventions and services. They apply these skills to research projects in epidemiology, health promotions/health communication, intervention development, community-based participatory research, and the social determinants of health.

SUPPORT

Each admitted doctoral student receives a competitive stipend, and students in good standing are eligible for year-round financial support, including payment of fees and tuition. Students are typically supported by teaching and research assistantships, which can be supplemented by fellowships, awards and other forms of financial assistance.
