Please read the following ALL THE WAY THROUGH as the information may represent a significant change in how mileage and ground transportation reimbursements are calculated for UCOP travelers.

Dear UCOP Travelers—

This week the BRC received the following clarifications from AVP and Systemwide Controller Arrivas' office regarding mileage, ground transportation and bridge toll reimbursements.

- UC does not pay commute costs. Only incremental, work-related transportation expenses are reimbursable.
- Business travel during the work week (regardless of time of day or night): UC reimburses mileage in excess of normal commute expenses. See the following examples:

Examples of business travel during	What is reimbursable?

Example 1	6 + 6 = 12 miles

Example 5 Home office in Pleasanton to UCOP: 29 miles UCOP to home office in Pleasanton: 29 miles Principal office is at home in Pleasanton	29 + 29 = 58 miles This is reimbursable because the primary work location is in Pleasanton and travel to UCOP is not part of normal commute.
Example 6	37 + 37 = 74 miles
Home office in Irvine to meeting	There are no normal commute costs to consider.
site in Riverside: 37 miles	
Meeting site in Riverside to home	
office in Irvine: 37 miles	
Principal office is at home in Irvine	
and offsite meetings are infrequent	30 + 14 + 15 + 13 – 30 – 13 = 29 miles
Example 7 Home office in Novato to field visit in Napa: 30 miles	The commute portion is determined by the first and last site visit for the day.

13 miles	
Principal office is at home, but

- Business travel on weekends or UC holidays: Report mileage from home to the destination (e.g., airport, train station, meeting site <u>other</u> than your work location).
- Mileage calculation should be based on the most direct route.
- The same reimbursement concept applies to public transportation reimbursements.
- Bridge tolls <u>associated with the commute portion of mileage</u> will *not* be reimbursed. For example, if you live in San Francisco, your work location is in Oakland, and you have a day trip to Sacramento, you may be reimbursed for the Carquinez Bridge toll, but not the Bay Bridge toll.

We are using these guidelines for all reimbursement requests effective immediately; travel reports currently in the queue will be adjusted accordingly.
